Soldier. Scholar. Mentor. Voice of conscience. Founder. **Andrew Bacevich is a national treasure.**

Andrew graduated from West Point in 1969 as a committed Cold Warrior and served in Vietnam during 1970–71. He spent 23 years in the Army, starting out as a commander of an armored cavalry platoon in Vietnam and eventually retiring with the rank of colonel in 1992.

Fault lines in the official narrative of the war started forming in his mind as he pursued his MA in American History and then a PhD in American Diplomatic History at Princeton. After leaving the Army he became a tenured Professor of History and International Relations at Boston University, where he mentored and inspired scores of students and faculty over the course of 25 years. He also became a first class public intellectual, connecting profoundly with people across the country through his prolific and insightful analysis calling out America's repeated wrong turns in foreign and diplomatic policy. With each book - 16 in all - and hundreds of essays, interviews, speeches, and documentaries, Andrew called out America's addiction to war with a historian's eye, Midwestern straight-talking logic, and great writing.

In 2019 duty called again. This time he heeded the call of a nascent think tank and communications

project that was planning to marshal Andrew's arguments against the post-9/11 "forever wars" and build an institution on that foundation. His energy, credibility, intellect and experience were instrumental in the formation of the Quincy Institute, which launched in December 2019. He served first as its President, then Chair, and now board member. He said the formation of this organization is one of the proudest accomplishments of his life.

The Quincy Institute is honored beyond measure to count him as a co-founder. On the fifth anniversary of our launch, we are establishing a fund to honor his service to our country and organization to underwrite the Andrew Bacevich Chair in American Diplomatic History at the Quincy Institute. The scholar in this auspiciously named chair will examine and expose the forces and policies that seek to perpetuate American militarism into the 21st century.


